# Sharing table

### Meeting with NGO's

An informative talk was conducted with 11 NGOs from Mexico, Guatemala, and the United States. The history of Philanthropiece AC was discussed, along with the association's programs and the activities carried out in Baja California Sur and other states of Mexico. Each member of Philanthropiece AC briefly explained their roles and responsibilities, and there was a summary of the collaborative activities and the purpose of the 2023 Experience Exchange.







#### Presentation of Objectives:

#### **General Objective:**

To experience a process of sharing experiences regarding the role of Community Savings Groups in financial inclusion as a resilience element against current socio-environmental events, as well as in building trust-based networks among neighbors to strengthen social cohesion.

#### **Specific Objectives:**

- Facilitate an exchange of experiences on lessons learned, successes, and challenges of Community Savings Groups (GAC).
- Reflect on the importance of socio-environmental justice in community development.
- Recognize the work of community liaisons and identify potential community promoters.

#### **Expectations:**

- Explore new ways to organize banking activities and seek challenges.
- Preserve and learn about the activities of other groups, their expectations, and most importantly, meet other participants and Philanthropiece staff in person.
- Strengthen our group and individual selves through such events.
- Learn about other experiences, methods, and build community with other groups in the Philanthropiece network. I have created two community banks, and I believe the experience is incredibly enriching for building collectivity and common prosperity, both financially and intangibly.
- Improve cash management skills.
- Obtain and share ideas for better accounting practices.
- Reinforce knowledge based on the experiences of fellow participants.

### Metrics

#### Conference

The presentation covered the following key points:

- Protecting our planet and ensuring a fair distribution of resources.
- Environmental justice recognizes that we can only thrive if the environment is healthy.
- Environmental justice must be reflected in solving issues related to air, water, and soil cleanliness.

Additionally, ways to participate in advocating for the right to Socio-Environmental Justice and protecting our rights to it were discussed.





#### Social Entrepreneurship Forum

Facilitator: Martha Drew Aguilar

**Participants:** Ilihana Carrillo Álvarez from GAC Yasen, José Ramón Arce Garcia from GAC El Saltito, Cristian Arce Mayoral from GAC La Purísima, Jerania Aguiñiga Meza and Leticia Meza Madrigal from GAC La Pitaya Ahorradora, Omar Guerrero and Guillermo Arce from GAC Supernova.

Through a discussion forum, participants of the Experience Exchange were introduced to members of five community savings groups who have experience in leveraging their ventures based on social and solidarity economy. The session began with an introduction of the groups, and the activity proceeded with each speaker having 15 to 20 minutes to present their ventures, including their origins, development, challenges, and progress. After the presentations, there was a Q&A session where the audience asked questions, and the speakers responded accordingly.

#### Main findings:

- In general, the entrepreneurship ideas originated from a community leader who identified a problem and involved more neighbors, peers, and/or family members to work together on the solution.
- The path of entrepreneurship has not been easy, but they have managed to overcome challenges.
- Savings, credits, and the organization of the savings group have been crucial for the advancement of their ventures.
- At least four of the groups received financial support from the FASOL organization to strengthen their projects. They expressed deep gratitude, commitment, and excitement for the support they received.
- All participants expressed their determination to continue their work.



#### World Café Trading Tables

Facilitators: Christian Zavala and Martha Márquez.

Using the World Café technique, exchange tables were set up where participants rotated from table to table as ambassadors, carrying the information previously shared. Each table had a host who collected the "golden nuggets" from each question, and at the end, the findings were shared in a plenary session.


